

Updating FontExplorer X Pro Plug-ins on the Mac

From time to time the FontExplorer X Pro plug-ins will be updated to provide new features, more stability or support for new Adobe or QuarkXPress applications. Detailed information on the changes can be found in the Plug-In Release Notes.

Before making any updates, it is always a good idea to make a backup of the plug-ins currently installed.

For Adobe Applications:

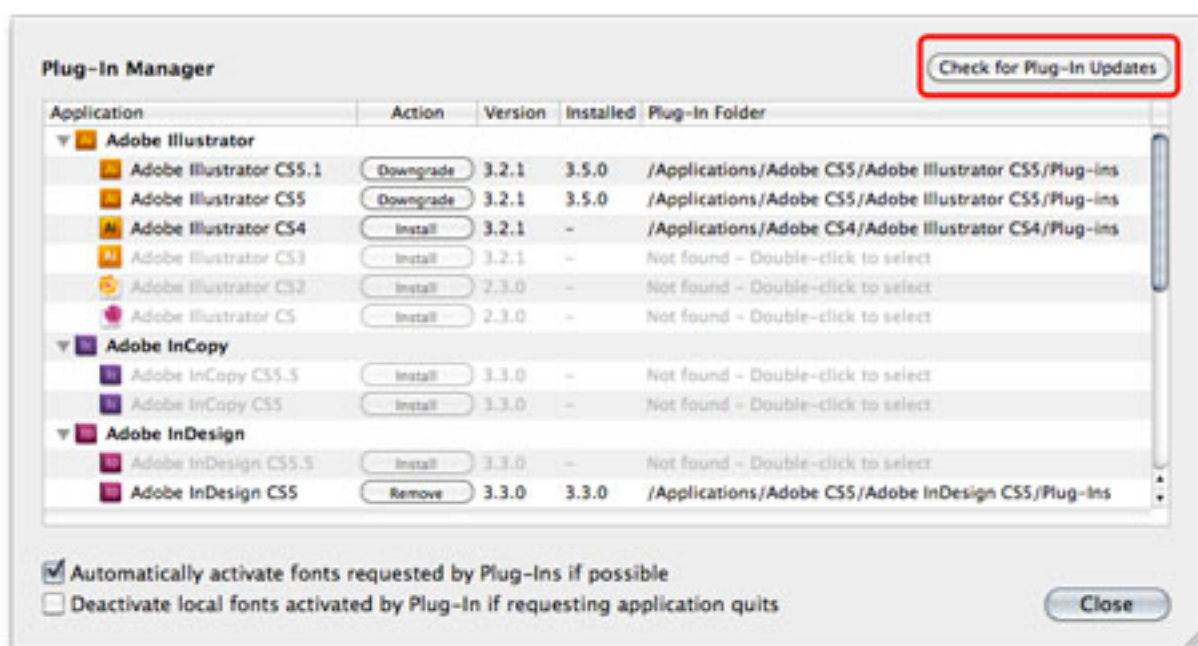
FontExplorer X plug-ins are located in the Adobe application "Plug-ins" folder. For example *"Applications/Adobe InDesign CS5/Plug-Ins/FontExplorer X for InDesign CS5.InDesignPlugin"*. Quit the Adobe application if it is running. Navigate to the Plug-ins folder and copy the FontExplorer X plug-in file to a backup location.

For QuarkXPress Applications:

FontExplorer X plug-ins are located in the QuarkXPress application "XTensions" folder. For example *"/Applications/QuarkXPress 9/XTensions/FontExplorer X for XPress 9.0.xnt"*. Quit the Quark application if it is running. Navigate to the *XTensions* folder and copy the FontExplorer X plug-in file to a backup location

FontExplorer X Pro Version 3.0 or Later

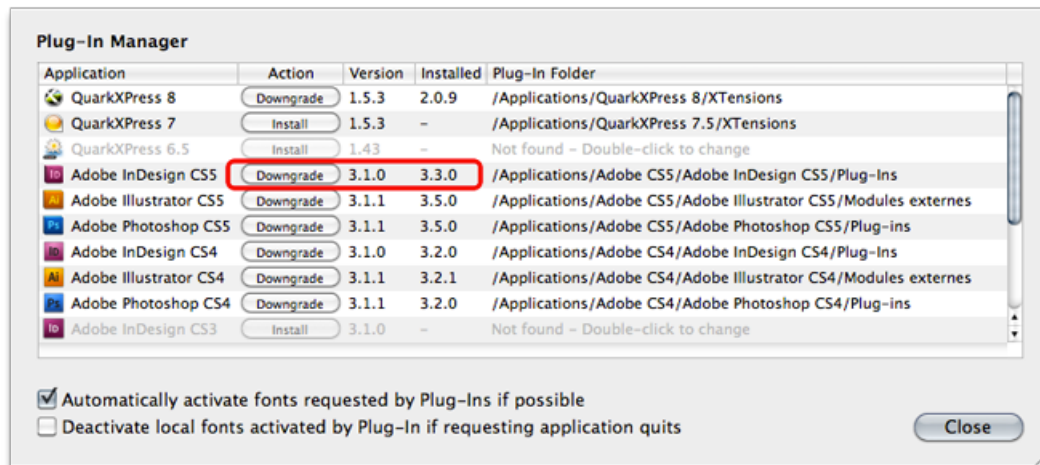
If you are working with a FontExplorer X Pro version 3.0 or later and have an internet connection, you can effortlessly update your plug-ins by using the integrated plug-in updater. To do this, go to the *Tools* menu and select the *Plug-In Manager...* menu item. Click the *Check for Plug-In Updates* button in the upper right corner.



The Plug-In Updater dialog appears listing the new versions that are available with information on the changes.



Click on *Update* to download the new plug-ins. FontExplorer X Pro will automatically restart after the update is complete. Open the Plug-in Manager window and update or install the new plugins.



Plug-ins that were not part of the original package (such as Adobe CS6) will not be shown in the *Plug-in Manager* dialog but communication between the application and FontExplorer X Pro will take place as will font activation.
